


Festival of Comedy

Jose Luis, an undertaker's employee, falls in love and marries the daughter of the Public Executioner. In order to obtain a modern flat, Jose Luis is persuaded by his father-in-law to accept the job of Public Executioner upon his own retirement. He agrees but only after being assured that his position will be in name only - he will never be required to carry out his duties. Years pass by, although Jose Luis lives in constant fear and scans the newspaper crime reports daily to reassure himself. The strain soon tells but life goes on happily until, one day, a registered letter arrives to inform him that he is required to go to Palma de Mallorca where a criminal is awaiting execution...

This powerful and ironic comedy on capital punishment is often hilariously funny and it is through the humour that the director shocks his audience into the realisation that when atrocities are committed in the name of the state, it is the executioner who becomes the victim.

Andrei Tarkovsky's **STALKER**



Andrei Tarkovsky is the most highly-regarded postwar Russian director, although his films have generally been considered too dark, mystical, and idiosyncratic to suit Soviet authorities. As a result, he has been able to make only five films in 20 years, among them two bonafide cult movies: the phantasmagoric medieval epic Andrei Roublev and the spectacular sciencefiction film Solaris. A Tarkovsky film is an experience – dense, visionary, metaphysical, epic, disturbing, overwhelming, fatiguing, and utterly original. Stalker is Tarkovsky's second venture into science fiction: 20 years before the story begins, a strange meteorite struck the Earth, creating a Bermuda-Triangle-like region known as the Zone. The Zone has been sealed off by troops and barbed wire, but special guides—known as "Stalkers"—have mentalist powers which enable them to penetrate the Zone and lead illegal expeditions into its interior. Stalker is the story of one such journey into the Zone, an eerie hybrid of industrial wasteland and primeval forest, where natural laws are suspended, where mirages and mindbending traps await the unwary traveller, and where, it is rumored, there exists a Room with the power to grant the innermost desires of whoever enters.

Into their placid circle enters an old schoolmate of Hjalmar's, whose driving purpose becomes the exposure of the lies and hypocrisy hidden under the family's peaceful surface, presumably to "enlighten" them. The excellent cast is headed by Bruno Ganz, Peter Kern, and Jean Seberg.

Winner of 4 Golden Globe Awards and nominated for 6 Academy Awards, Thomas Hardy's "Tess of the d'Urbervilles" has been exquisitely brought to the screen in this richly textured masterpiece by Roman Polanski. A change of pace from the violence and sexuality of earlier Polanski films, TESS exudes a dark, melancholic mood tinged with sensuality. The screenplay follows, with fidelity, Hardy's original novel, essentially a love story about a young English country girl whose family discovers it is descended from distinguished aristocratic lineage. The story development takes us through her tragic seduction, the birth and death of her child born out of wedlock and her hard life. Her tragic flaws of honesty and pride in a hypocritical society lead to her fateful outcome.

The story centers on the young and gifted between her devotion to Olive Chancellor (Vanessa Redgrave), a wealthy Bostonian suffragette who seeks to mold Varena into the spokesperson for the feminist cause, and Basil Ransom (Christopher Reeve), a charming Southern reactionary who wants to carry her off to a life of passion and domesticity.



WHO SHALL LIVE AND WHO SHALL DIE?

While millions were dying in Nazi death camps, a battle was underway in Washington to persuade the Allies to help rescue the Jews of Europe. Requests were made to bomb Auschwitz, set up a Jewish army, buy Jews, construct rescue havens, and organize commando raids into the camps. All were turned down.

WHO SHALL LIVE AND WHO SHALL DIE? is the searing indictment that exposes for the first time the extent of American involvement in the extermination of European Jewry. Already compared to THE SORROW AND THE PITY, WHO SHALL LIVE AND WHO SHALL DIE? adds to the literature of the Holocaust and American history.
