BEST DIRECTOR--Cannes Film Festival, 1987

Based on poems by Rainer Maria Rilke, and co-written by long-time collaborator Peter Handke, WINGS OF DESIRE is as much a re-examination of the divided city of Berlin and its almost spectral inhabitants, as it is a thoroughly romantic love story. Damiel, played by Bruno Ganz, is an angel who has grown tired and frustrated at his inability to affect the people over whom he watches in his weightless existence. Visiting a travelling circus, he encounters a beautiful trapeze artist with whom he immediately falls in love. Egged on by a former angel, who is now an actor in a film about the war, he decides to leave the heavens and enter the mortal world of earthly delights. Cinematographer Henri Alekan, whose credits include Cocteau's BEAUTY AND THE BEAST and Wyler's ROMAN HOLIDAY, blends rich black and white photography with bright burst of color to contrast the delapidated, glum Berlin of yesterday with a new and vital city, heaven with earth, aloofness with love.

SILVER BEAR--Berlin Film Festival, 1988 BEST FILM--International Critics Prize

Twenty years "on the shelf" have not dimmed the luster or the humanity of COMMISSAR, Alexsandr Askoldov's gentle drama about the birth of a baby during the tumult of the Russian civil war.

In the flurry over the release of the long-banned film, the question of quality has taken a backseat to the revelation of the controversy that condemned it in 1967. Well, this production is a gem, in the great tradition of the early Soviet cinema. Rich with simplicity and grandeur, it speaks to us today across the years precisely because it is stripped of false heroics.

The sardonic humor and irony of a Shalom Aleichem story runs through this tale about a pregnant Red Army commissar who is billeted with a poor Jewish family barely able to meet the needs of their own six rambunctious children. The luminous black-and-white cinematography and the superb, delicate bittersweet score blend into a remarkable whole that underlines the resignation, anxiety and hope permeating a land gripped by revolution and civil war.

Gonza Spearman

During the Tokugawa shogunate, provincial lords were obliged to spend alternate years in Edo, the capital city. Wives and children were left behind--and this often resulted in tragedy. Brilliantly photographed, GONZA THE SPEARMAN is a sumptuous adaptation of a noted 18th-century bunraku (puppet theater) play relating one such instance.

The handsome but overly ambitious Gonza Sasano is one of the Matsue clan's most talented lancers. Although he is already engaged to the sister of one of his fellow retainers, Gonza agrees to wed the daughter of his lord to better his position. The fiance's infuriated brother then plots against Gonza, seemingly catching him in an indiscretion with their master's wife. Unable to prove their innocence, Gonza and the lord's wife must flee. This classic tale of the conflicts between love and honor, duty and devotion, won a Silver Bear at the Berlin Film Festival.

Winner of the Golden Bear at the 1988 Berlin Film Festival, where it was hailed as the film "which puts Chinese cinema on the map," RED SORGHUM is a sweeping modern-day fable that parallels the life story of an intrepid young woman with the history of China in the turbulent period of the 1930s & 1940s. The film's epic structure is divided into distinct and dialectically resonant parts, each with its own style and historical background. The first half is a lusty romantic comedy telling of a nervous young bride's arrival at a remote provincial winery, her wooing by a clumsily passionate peasant, her abduction by a notorious bandit chieftain, and her successful assumption of the family business when her aged husband is mysteriously but conveniently murdered. The second half is a heroic and harrowing war drama dealing with enemy brutality and partisan resistance fighting during the Japanese occupation of China. Zhang demonstrates a storyteller's as well as a cameraman's gift, enlivening his stirring tale with a mixture of violent action, epic lyricism and tongue-in-cheek swagger reminiscent of Leone and Kurosawa.

FAREWELL

The construction of a hydro-electric power station on a large river in Siberia necessitates relocation of a number of hamlets and villages which are situated in the flooding zone and therefore must cease to exist. Among them is Matyora, a village where the family of Pinegins live. They are old Darya, her son Pavel and her grandson Andrei. All her life Darya lived in Matyora. She was born here. Became a bride and got married. She worked and raised her children. Years passed, she grew old. For her there is no place dearer, closer to the heart, more indispensable than Matyora. Her heart and mind cannot accept that soon Matyora will be no more. Why should one destroy the old in order to acquire the new, if one can have both? This riddle Darya is unable to solve. Pavel Pinegin is different. He is also sorry for Matyora. However, he realizes clearly that the advent of the new cannot be halted. It becomes his sad and painful duty to destroy the native village. To Andrei, Pavel's son and Daryra's grandson, everything is clear. Matyora is good, but the power station is better. He takes things in their stride, without grief of spiritual torment. The question whether too high a price is being paid for acquisition of the new is being faced by all the protagonists of the film, each answering in his own way. The film, elegiac in tone, mourns a lost Russia, the traditional peasant existence engulfed in the Soviet surge into the modern world.

Sweet Hours

One of Carlos Saura's most deeply felt films, SWEET HOURS is an achingly sweet memoir that blends dark humor, nostalgia, fantasy, domestic comedy, and social comment with Saura's distinctive mixture of absurdism and grace. The hero, Juan, is a gentle, contemplative playwright who is obsessed with the past--with the War, with his family, with his uncle (a devoted and surprisingly poetic--Nazi), with his maid, with the film GILDA, and with his stunning mother. The film circles around through Juan's memories in elegant pirouettes bringing the viewer in and about Juan's life.

Carlos Saura was born January 4, 1932 in Huesca, Spain. In 1935 the Saura family moved to Madrid--one year later Spain's Civil War started. The war had a profound impact on Carlos and he once said, "It is possibly the period of my life that I remember most accurately." This impact shows up again and again in his films.

From 1950 to 1953 he worked as a roving photographer, before enrolling in Madrid's Instituto de Investigaciones y Experiencias Cinematograficas. After graduation Saura taught, first at the Institute and then at the Official Cinema School.

In Saura's film, SWEET HOURS, he returns again to the subject of Spain's troubled past and to his continuing exploration of memory and hope.

Carlos Saura currently lives in Madrid with his three sons, Shane, Carlos and Antonio. Photography remains his favorite pastime.

Ana is the nine year old heroine of CRIA. Ana has an uncanny talent for observing and understanding scenes not meant for her eyes. She watches bitter quarrels between her parents, witnesses her mother's painful death from cancer, and gravely shoulders the awesome responsibility of this knowledge. This is a film about the darker side of childhood, about superstition, knowledge and the loss of innocence.





The world fame of Carl Th. Dreyer is based on the fourteen feature films he created from 1919 to 1964. Less widely known are several informative and documentary short films which Dreyer created in the 1940 and 1950s to the order of government agencies. THEY CAUGHT THE FERRY advocates sensible traffic and with this film Dreyer produced a dramatic short feature film inspired by a short story by the Danish author Johannes V. Jensen who in 1944 won the Nobel Prize for Literature. A young couple races cross-country in order to catch a ferry but the ferry they catch is not the one they had in mind.



KATHARINE HEPBURN SIR RALPH RICHARDSON DEAN STOCKWELL JASON ROBARDS, JR.

Author Eugene O'Neill described this late autobiographical masterpiece as a "play of old sorrow, written in tears and blood...with deep pity and understanding and forgiveness." An account of his explosive homelife, fused by a drug-addicted mother, a father who wallows in drink after realizing he is no longer a famous actor and an older brother who is emotionally unstable and misfit. The family is reflected by the youngest son who at age 23 is a would-be poet. LONG DAY'S JOURNEY INTO NIGHT was the first film in history in which all four stars received Best Acting Awards from the Cannes Film Festival.

La Femme Enfant

Set in a small town in the north of France, LA FEMME ENFANT is the story of a lonely llyear-old girl, Elizabeth and her disturbing love affair with a 40-year-old mute caretaker, Marcel, played by Klaus Kinski.

The film begins three years into their relationship—an unsettling combination of manipulation and genuine tenderness—and chronicles its painful disintegration as Elizabeth matures and begins to yearn for life outside of their make-believe universe. An atmospheric, lyrical tale that walks a thin line between the delicate and the shocking.


