





One of the most important films in cinema history, and one that has exercised a considerable and lasting influence, CALIGARI was the first attempt at expression of a creative mind through the motion picture medium. Produced during a period when expressionism and cubism were doctrines of the advanced schools of the arts, it was a revelation. Its amazing use of deliberately distorted backdrops, sparing use of the simplest props, and high contrasts in lighting are all designed to accent the terror of its story. In it, the audience shares the experiences of a madman and is carried into a world of unreality and escape.

Set in modern-day Iran, the story tells of an eight-year-old boy Ali and his younger sister, Zahra, who are accustomed to shouldering much responsibility. When Ali loses Zahra's only—and recently mended—pair of shoes, the siblings are too scared to tell their father about the loss and can't afford to buy another pair. When the shoes are finally found on another girl, who probably needs them just as much, it's up to the boy to find a way to get his sister a new pair of shoes. 


